# 1. Are You Licensed, Bonded, and Insured?

Ensure the contractor has a valid license, is bonded, and carries adequate insurance:

#### License:

Verify the contractor's license is current and applicable to your state.

#### Bond:

Confirm the contractor is bonded, providing financial protection if they fail to complete the job.

#### Insurance:

Ensure the contractor has general liability and worker?s compensation insurance to protect against accidents and damages.

# 2. Can You Provide References from Recent Projects?

Ask for references from recent projects, ideally within the past few months:

## **Recent References:**

Request contact information for recent clients and follow up with them to gauge their satisfaction with the work performed.

## **Reviews and Testimonials:**

Look for online reviews and testimonials to supplement your research.

## 3. What is Your Experience with Insurance Claims?

Determine the contractor?s experience with handling insurance claims:

Ask for estimated start and completion dates.

Discuss how they handle weather-related delays.

Request a detailed, written estimate for the project:

Ensure the estimate includes a comprehensive cost breakdown for materials, labor, and any additional fees.

## 10. What Materials Will You Use?

Discuss the materials the contractor plans to use:

Ensure they use high-quality materials that meet your standards.

# Manufacturer Warranties:

Ask about any manufacturer warranties that come with the materials.

# 11. Do You Have Any Certifications or Affiliations?

Inquire about any professional certifications or affiliations with industry organizations:

## **Certifications:**

Look for certifications from reputable roofing manufacturers or trade organizations.

## Affiliations:

Membership in industry associations can indicate a commitment to professionalism and ongoing education.

# 12. How Do You Handle Customer Complaints?

Understand the contractor?s process for handling customer complaints:

Inquire about any satisfaction guarantees or policies.
